MESSAGE FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Dear Students, Families and Friends of the College

Our students have settled in well, the paint has dried on the walls of the five new demountables and the teachers have shifted the proverbial academic gear in all areas. I trust you have received the student interim reports and as a team, we endeavour to address any concerns in a timely manner.

With the interim reports fresh off the press, I would like to share a message that lies heavily on my heart; we as teachers and parents urgently need to start teaching *repair*.

It is urgent that our children learn and respect that not everything slightly tarnished or imperfect needs to be replaced or thrown out. We have fallen victim to a culture where it is too easy to replace or dismiss anything that does not immediately go our way. Often a quick fix or a one-minute makeover is the most effort we will apply to situations or relationships that go wrong. We as the mentors have fallen prey to modelling this problem solving technique to our children. It is imperative that we actively teach our children that pain, relationships, problems and failure can be repaired, if we are willing to do the hard yards and walk the extra mile. There is much wisdom lost and forgotten in the old ways of repairing an object before we merely toss it aside. Repair takes hard work and much intricate problem solving. We need to earnestly start teaching and modelling by example how to repair relationships, attitudes, our family life and work ethic, to name but a few. Repair is healing and growing, not replacing or dismissing.

As a community, we need to show our children that we are working hard at repairing all that is wrong in our lives. Reach out for help and strive to be better and completely whole again. Our children must witness our honest efforts to repair and replenish all that is valuable. We all fall short in some way or another and are in need of repair.




