



FACT SHEET - HAND SANITISER

Hand sanitisers have become a common control measure against the risk of transmission of Covid-19. Many hand sanitisers contain high levels of alcohol (60 to 80%), which classifies them as a hazardous substance with potential hazards including fire, explosion, poisoning, and serious eye irritation.

Supervision should be provided when using hand sanitiser. They need to be stored and kept:

- at temperatures below 25°;
- away from heat sources, sparks and open flames; and
- in a cool well ventilated areas.

If hand sanitiser is swallowed (even small amounts) act quickly and contact the Poisons Information Centre 13 11 26.




















Students add colour to the world




Year 10s have been designing a piece of Australian flora and cutting it out of the linoleum before printing it to see the final result.



Managing events during COVID-19

- We encourage registration to ensure capacity to cater for group size.


