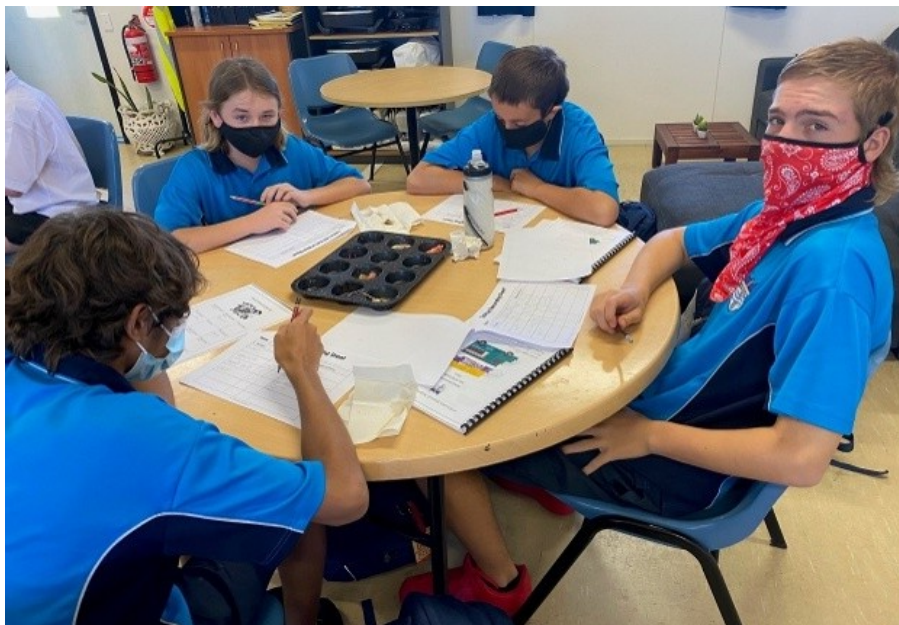

# YEAR 3/4M

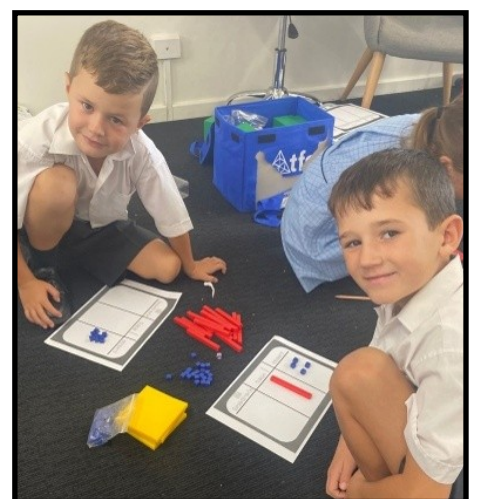

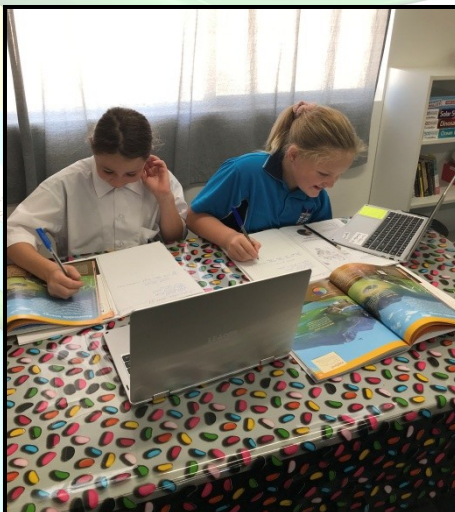
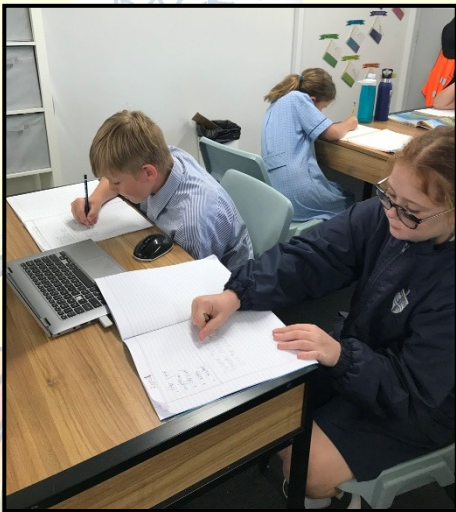

Students enjoyed constructing their own anemometer (a device used to measure wind speed). They are looking forward to creating a project plan that will allow them to measure the wind speed around our school.

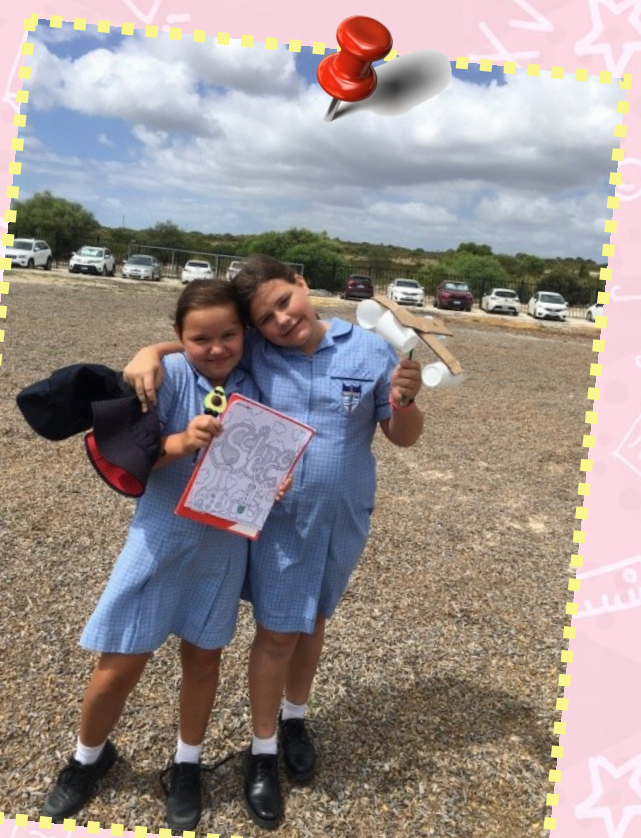




# YEAR 5/6S

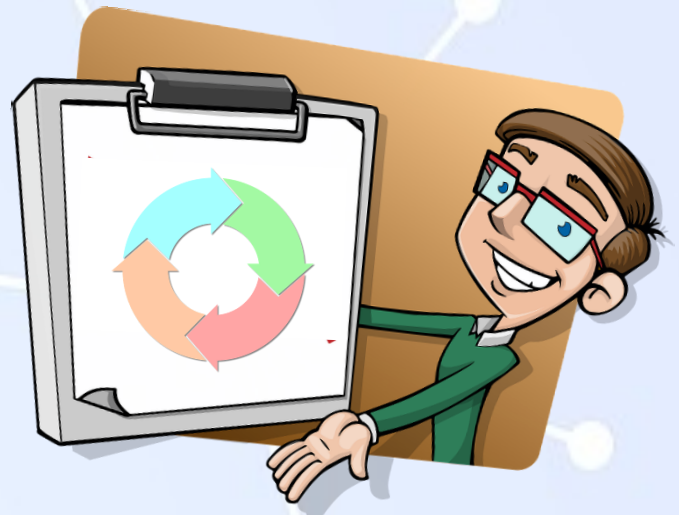

Secondary students did a taste analysis. They have also been making American meatball subs and bacon and egg muffins during the Food Technology class.

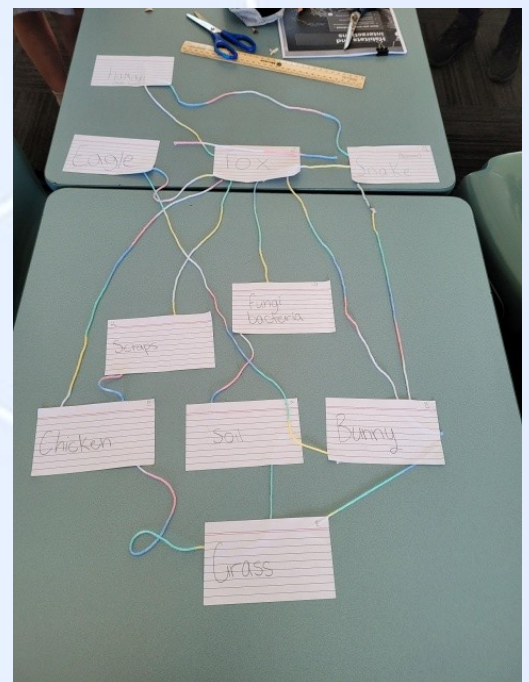
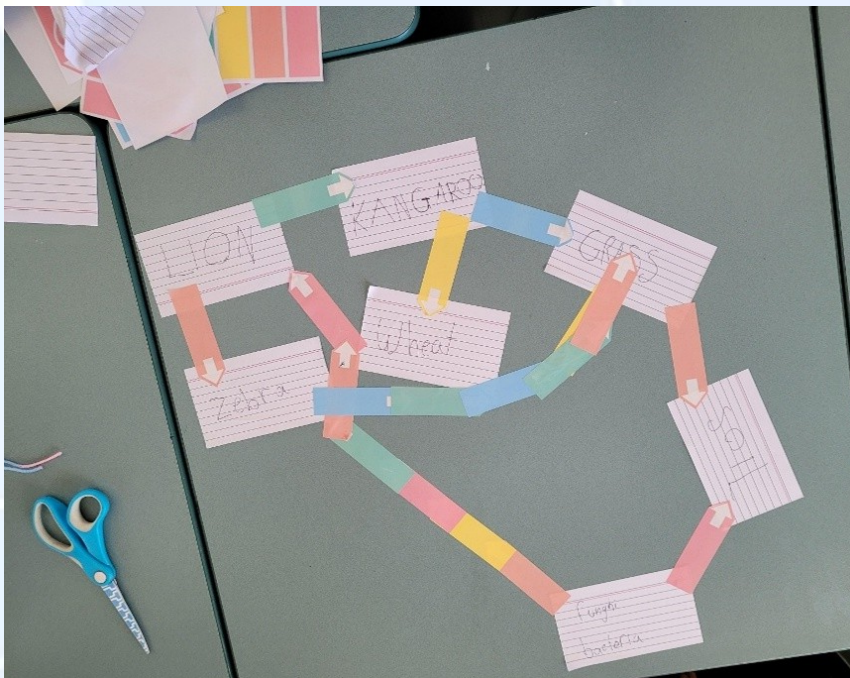

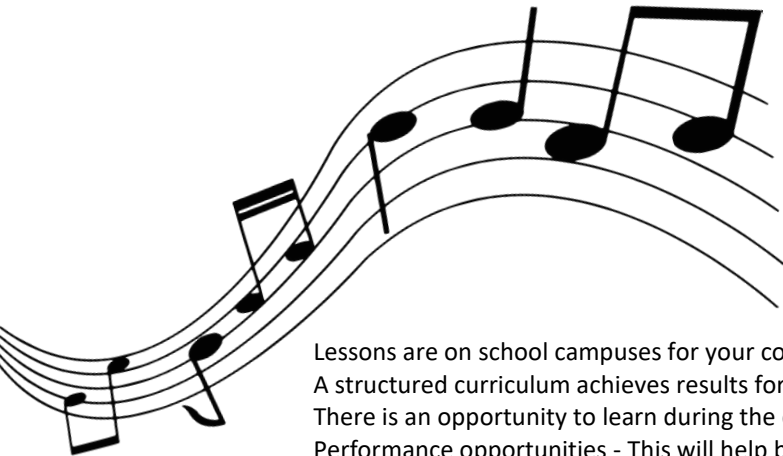
