With seven Paralympic Games appearances, **Trischa Zorn-Hudson** is the most decorated Paralympic athlete of all time with 55 medals (41 gold, 9 silver, 5 bronze). **A FREE program that teaches practical and effective ways to enhance family relationships and manage common child behaviour issues.**

## Who is this program for?

Parents, carers and/or grandparents of a child aged between 3 and 8 years.

## What is involved?

- **Seminar Series** – 90-minute talks on:
  - children's behaviour – the tough part of parenting
  - raising confident children
  - raising emotionally resilient children.
- **Discussion Group** – small, 2-hour groups:
  - misbehaving
  - fighting and aggression
  - bedtime routine
  - hassle-free shopping with children.
- **Group Triple P** – 8-week parenting course.



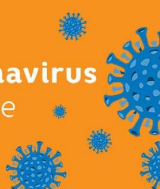
