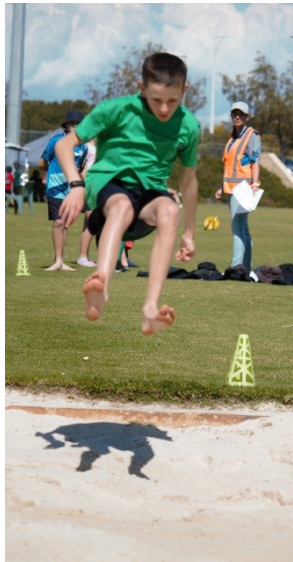

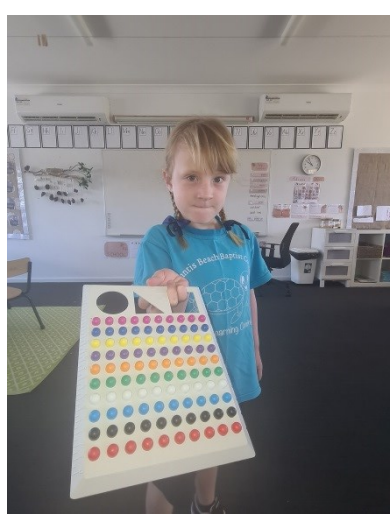


Learning about taking care of our plants and our new worm farm we received for winning the trash to treasure competition

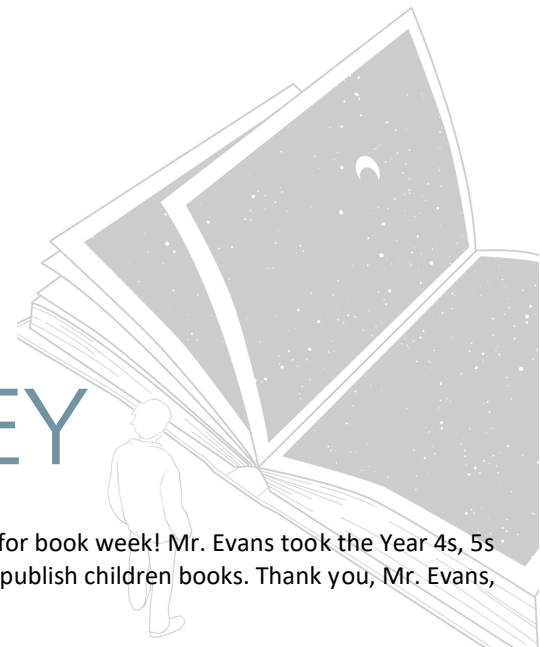
'X' marks the Spot! Year 5S had fun walking around the school discovering different co-ordinate points.

COMPETING FOR TOP HONOURS

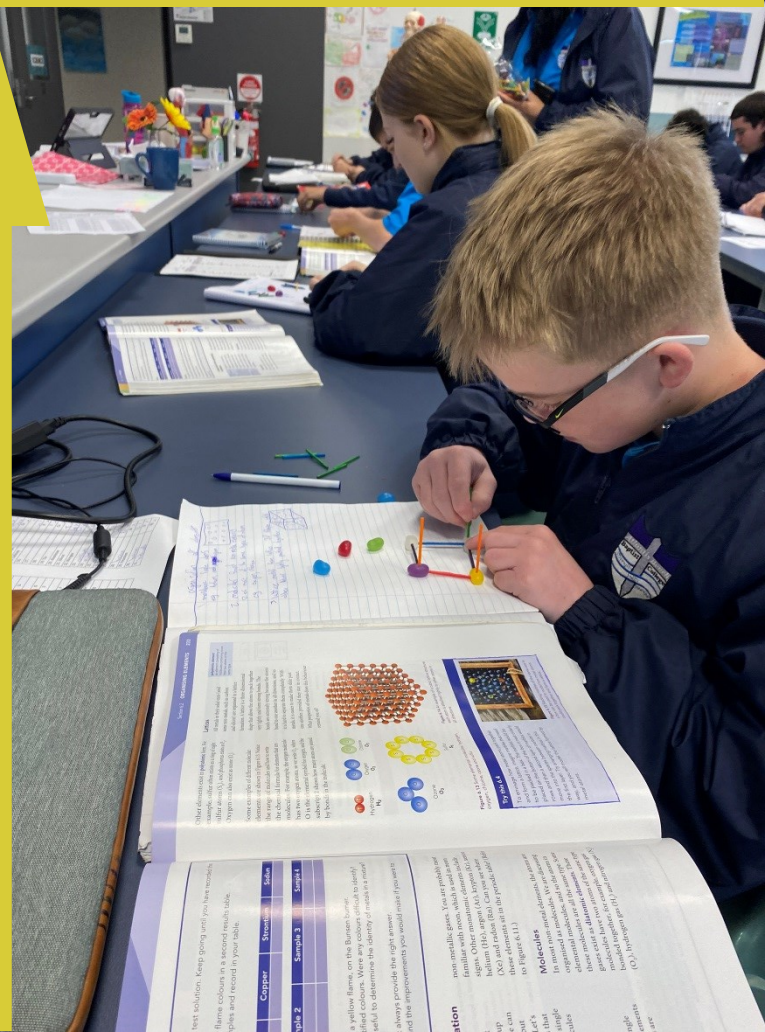

The Year 8s built models of a crystal lattice structure, using lollies and toothpicks.



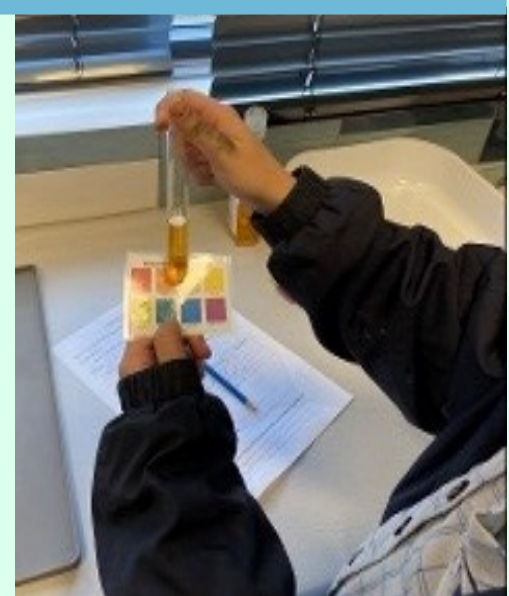


SCIENCE
