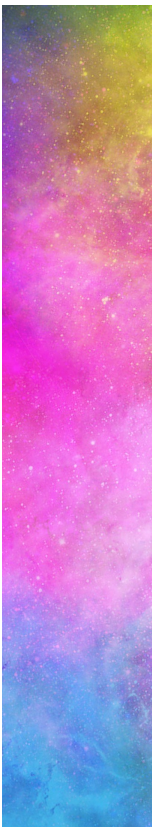

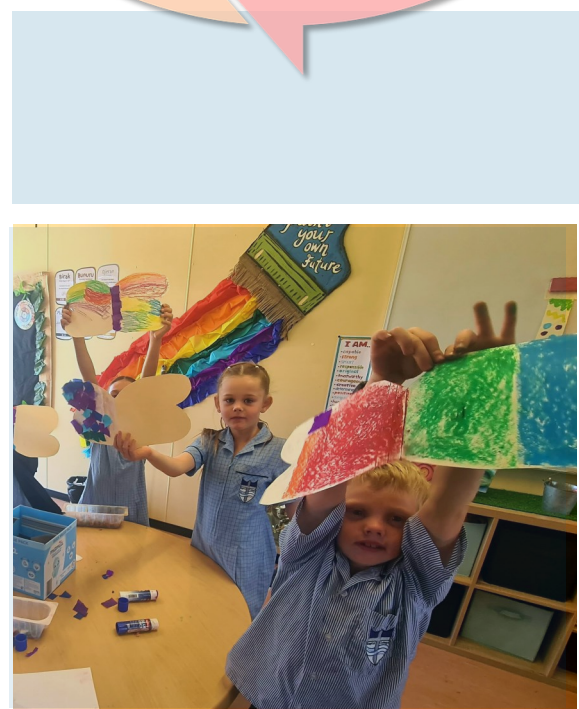
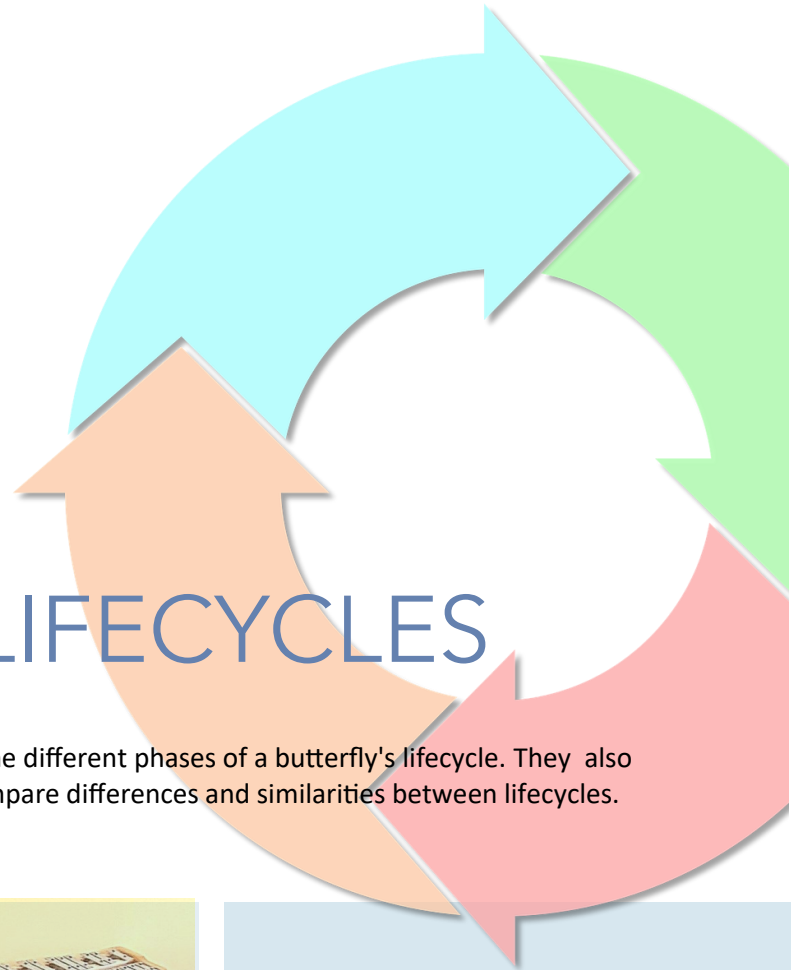
Digging for dinosaur remains and eggs proves to be hard work but an exciting adventure nonetheless.

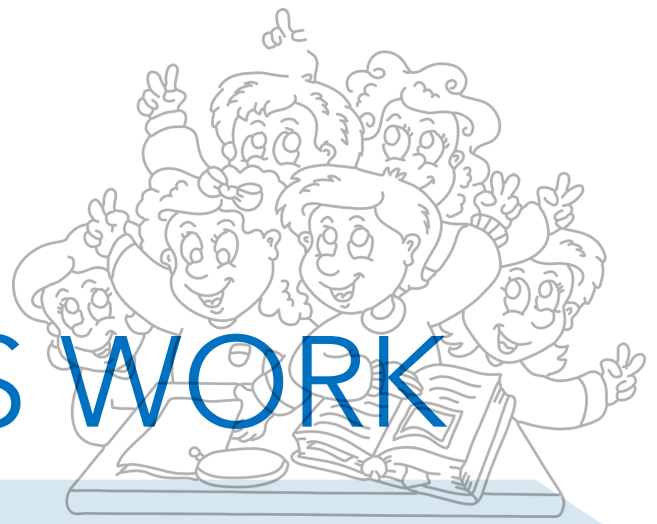
INVESTIGATING LIFECYCLES

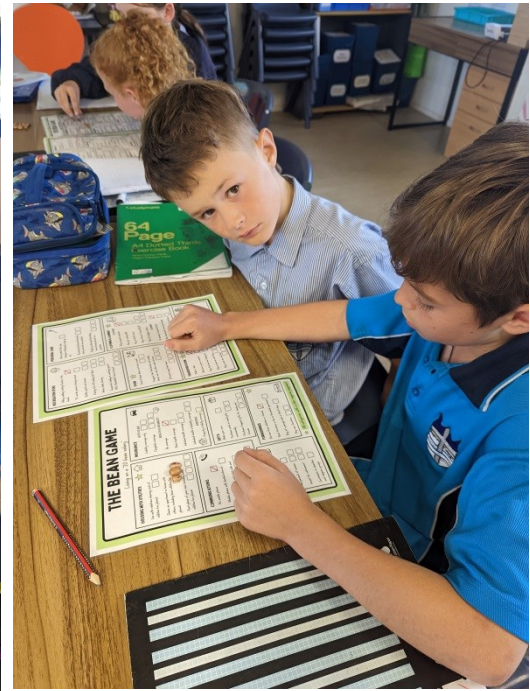
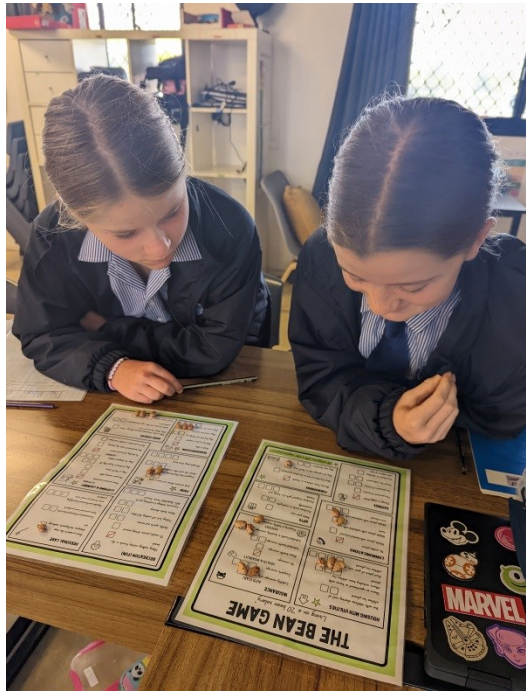
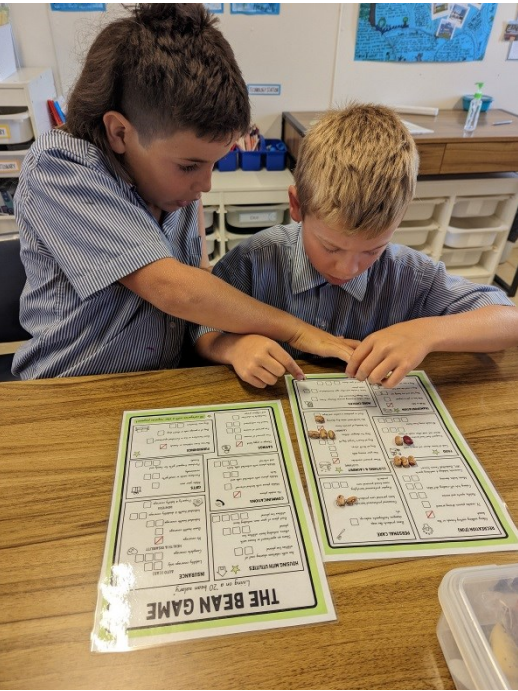
Year 5S

Year 5S pretended to be a planet in the solar system, rotating and orbiting just like real life. They learnt all about the movement of objects in outer space.

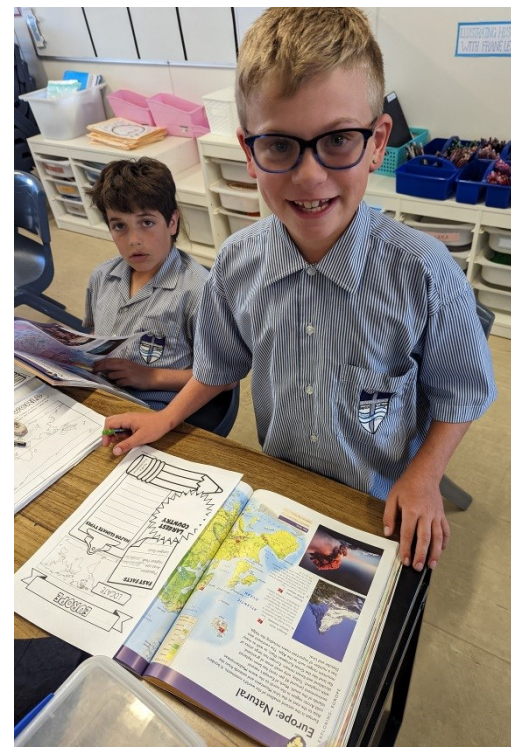
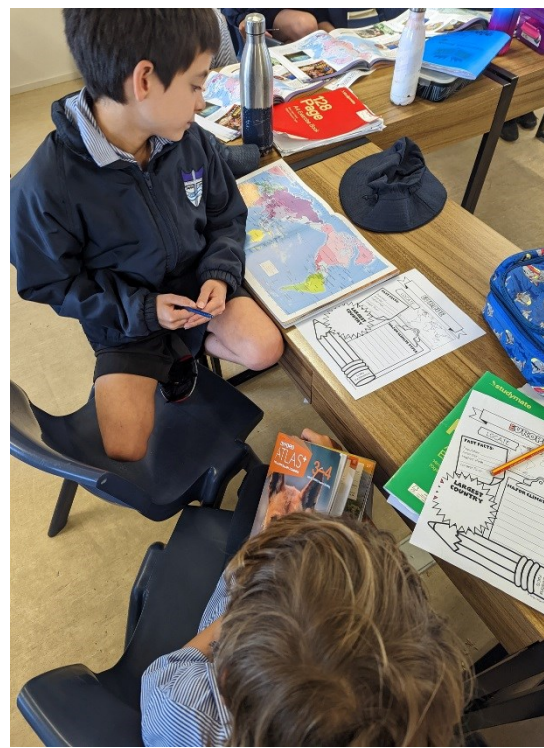

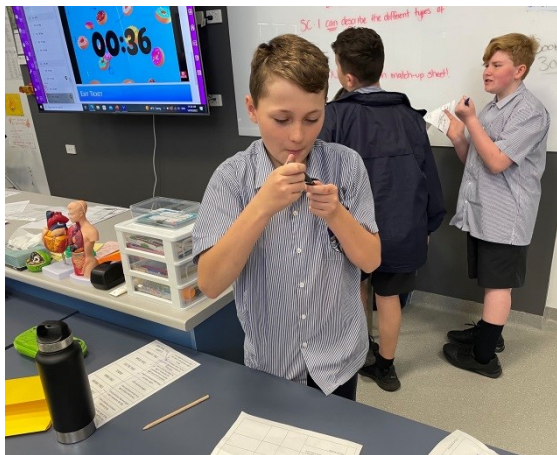
Year 7 students applying science inquiry skills to their paper plane designs

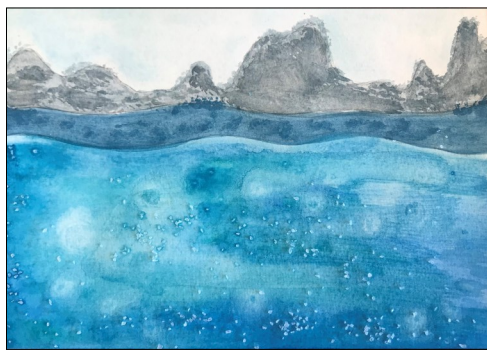
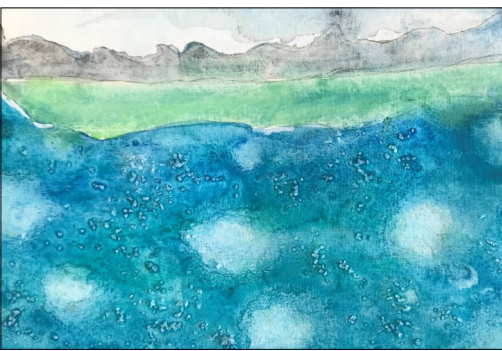


Sewing Christmas stockings, printing gift bags and constructing ornaments formed part of the preparation for the Christmas market stall.

Jenni Vandermoezel visited the Specialist Visual Art class again and showed students the ropes with different watercolour techniques.

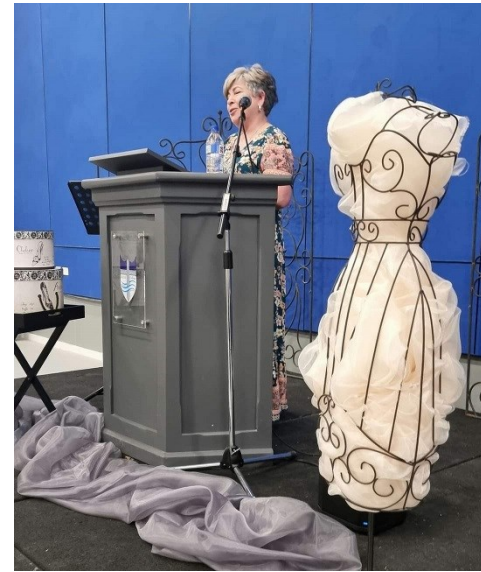
