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# 1. Our History

Atlantis Beach Baptist College was founded by members of Baptist Communities Ltd. and opened the gates for students on 1<sup>st</sup> February 2017. The vision of the College staff was that God had directed them to impact and serve the growing Perth Northern Coastal communities. The College meets the urgent need for a local secondary school in Two Rocks for children to attend. We believe the Atlantis Beach Baptist community brings glory to God and is building a legacy for generations to come.

The College is a Christian organisation with an open enrolment policy and constitutionally known as The Atlantis Beach Baptist College LTD. Our College Board provides Godly and reliable governance. The college caters for children from Kindergarten to Year 10 and will progress to Year 11 in 2024 and then Year 12 in 2025.

## 2. Our Crest



Our College Crest displays our college name within a shield outline to signify our motto:

The **crown** represents God the King who is central to our identity and who we declare as having ultimate ownership and sovereignty over our College.

The **cross** represents Jesus Christ who we recognise as our Lord and Saviour.

The **wave** design represents the inspiration of the Holy Spirit, like the movement of water which also reflects our geography, being a coastal area.

The College motto encompasses our College core values:

- Staff are trained and mentored in the programmes of how to be bring Christianity into daily curriculum teaching.
- As the introduction for Year 11 and Year 12 has been announced, our teachers are supported to update their training and qualifications to facilitate our growth.

# • Teaching and Learning

#### **Initiatives:**

- To upgrade our functional ICT system that supports student learning outcomes and administrative systems to a more advanced level.
- Intentional differentiation of the curriculum for all year levels and learning areas which includes support and extension.
- Specialised student and teacher programs for learning support and gifted programs are introduced.
- The College develops a digital library for age-appropriate digital resources.
- School library area expanded and further resourced with a specific focus on appropriate upper school reading material.
- Build a nature play area and a fitness play area in Primary.

#### **Action Plan:**

- All classes from Year 2 are equipped with a set of 32 laptops for student use.
- Furnish an IT lab with 32 standalone computers.
- Employ a leadership person in Lower and Upper Primary to develop whole school content.
- Area is prepared to establish a nature play setting.

#### **Key Performance Indicators:**

- Student performance data will reflect improvements in their engagement in learning. and academic growth.
- Annual report survey will reflect overall improved rates of satisfaction.
- College will participate in Academic Extension competitions and programmes.

# Staff and Leadership

Our College is governed by the College Board and is led in Management by the Principal and the Deputy Principal. The Management portfolios will provide for the effective running of day-to-day academic school operations. Atlantis Beach Baptist College promotes Staff and Student Leadership by empowering individuals to confidently apply a range of ethical life skills and knowledge utilising their personal talents and abilities. The College Board and Leadership are a cohesive team planning for the successful expansion of the College.

#### **Initiatives:**

- Commensurate to student enrolment numbers increasing, the College will introduce middle -leadership roles in Upper and Lower Primary.
- The College staff are practicing, committed Christians, supportive of the College Vision and Mission. They provide an outstanding Christian teaching and learning culture. ABBC employees are required to provide an annual Statements of Faith.

#### **Action Plan:**

- Personal Development of staff in leadership and financial management. Including senior members of staff to integrate and gain experience in the day to day running and management of the College.
- Inviting the Deputy Principal to participate and attend a number of Board Planning meetings to gain experience and assure a realistic action plan is in place in the event that the Principal is incapacitated.
- Staff attend and participate in regular devotions during staff meetings. Staff are encouraged to regularly attend their place of worship.

#### **Key performance Indicators:**

- Upper and Lower primary whole school development initiatives introduced and successfully implemented.
- Staff are valued and appreciated when given the opportunity to value add to management strategies and processes.
- The staff's personal faith journeys are supported and nourished throughout their career.

## Financial

# • Facilities and Infrastructure

The Atlantis Beach Baptist Community in Two Rocks has seen exponential growth in the last six years. The College's expansion has been steady and commensurate with student enrolment numbers. The College focus for the next few years will be in establishing inclusive communal areas for our students to play in, eat and participate in various sporting activities. Our attention will be given to finishing off projects and paying attention to detail around the campus.

- Last phase of the power upgraded by connecting to the Western Power grid to secure constant and secure electricity to the College.
- Develop a nature play area in the Early Learning Centre focussed on play-based learning.
- Establish four new permanent demountable classrooms in the Secondary area of the campus.
- Fitness climbing play area introduced and fenced off for Year 1/2 play area.
- Further intensive Garden and Landscaping initiative. Native and water wise succulents planted. Reticulation laid to various areas of the College yard.
- Shade and seating provided in various areas of the campus.

#### **Key Performance Indicators:**

- Steady uninterrupted power supply, air conditioning and Internet connection throughout the day.
- Students enjoy shaded seating and compliance to Sun Smart School regulations adhered to.
- Schoolyard collisions, minor accidents and injuries minimised with designated year cohort shaded play areas.
- Sport areas established on the campus accommodating classes and limiting bus trips to nearby facilities.
- Additional classroom space for expansion and College growth with the four new classrooms.
- Aesthetics of the College improved, limiting sand mitigation on windy days.



# Community

The Atlantis Beach Baptist College community has an awareness of God's eternal love and are provided with the opportunity to grow in personal faith through Biblical knowledge. The College is a safe, caring and positive environment where self-discipline and respect are consistently demonstrated. We value our community partnerships and seek to build trust and rapport within the surrounding catchment areas.

#### Initiatives:

The college actively supports local business in Two Rocks. The college makes a
positive contribution to local charities and supports community causes in our area

- e.g. Lions, Sea Shepherds, Youth Cadets, Beachy Clean-Ups and Snake Avoidance Programs.
- Our student enrolment focus is on Gingin, Gabbadah, Woodridge, Red Hill, Lancelin, Sovereign Hill and more to the north. School bus companies are recruited to advertise for the college with decals.
- Local charities and community initiatives are supported and represented by the College in our newsletters and on our Facebook page e.g. Beach Clean-up and recycle projects.

#### **Action Plan:**

- Business accounts are held at local suppliers and contractors are recruited from advertisements in the local community Two Rocks/Yanchep Facebook pages.
- Bus companies have agreed to place College decals on their busses in support of the College.
- Educational events and youth opportunities are (at the Principal's discretion)
   promoted in our College newsletter and on our College Facebook page.

#### **Key Performance Indicators**

- Local business gladly support the College when approached for sponsorship and spread goodwill by word of mouth.
- Student knowledge of and participation in the Christian Education curriculum indicates a growing Biblical understanding.
- There is growing community participation in Christian groups and activities and support for the College's Christian ethos.
- Feedback from the school community indicates that our pastoral care program is meeting their needs.
